Nick is a Fellow of the UK Higher Education Academy and a Chartered Psychologist and Associate Fellow of the British Psychological Society (BPS). He is the Founding Director of the Chester Research Unit for the Psychology of Health (CRUPH) where he is also research lead for the Psychosocial Oncology Research Group, and co-leads the Contextual Behavioural Science Research Lab. Nick regularly travels around the UK and abroad to present research seminars and to facilitate training for healthcare professionals who provide psychological support for cancer patients. In 2015, Nick was appointed Chair of the International Psycho-Oncology Society (IPOS) Research Committee, and is a member of the Maggie's Cancer Centres Professional Advisory Board Research Subcommittee.



Can surfing the net make you better? What to do when seeing a psychologist is not an option.


